We believe that a child's time in school should be exciting and memorable; the best years of their life! We offer not just an outstanding academic education, but also a broad range of fun activities and life experiences.

Our Enrichment Programme

There are music opportunities with extra lessons in guitar, violin and keyboard. Children can also learn to cook! Occasionally we have children who are not reaching their potential within the normal curriculum and may have a special educational need.

At Gayton Junior School we believe that all children with special educational needs (short and long term) have the right to a broad, well-balanced and where possible, inclusive curriculum. The early identification and assessment and continual monitoring of children's needs is essential. Our Special Education Needs Coordinator (SENCo) and the support team will work with the child and their family and liaise with educational or health specialists where appropriate.
