Vocabulary Development

This year our school development focus is on vocabulary. Your children might have already told you about Mr Kettle's Word of the Week initiative which is designed to introduce children to a range of words they might use in their written work. Examples so far this year have included 'herculean', 'cacophony' and 'inconsolable'.

This will also help children in their reading: we often find children do not have a good grasp of more formal language or words and phrases which are less frequently used nowadays like 'midday', 'bar of soap', 'vital' and 'recall'. Acquisition of a wider vocabulary is even harder for children who do not always speak English at home, so we will be working to develop ways in which we can make it easier for these children in the classroom. Of course, one of the best ways to develop a good vocabulary is wider reading — reading often and reading a range of different genres!

Mrs Orchard is also leading a new initiative in school called Talk for Learning. This will give the children more opportunities to be involved in well-structured discussions with their peers



and to test out the new vocabulary they are learning. Giving children more opportunities to be actively engaged in lessons will make them more confident learners.

Holiday Clubs

<u>Safeguarding</u>

Childline has launched a website aimed at children under the age of 12. This provides age appropriate content on topics including: bullying, family, friends, feelings, school, abuse and staying safe. The NSPCC has released findings from a survey of almost 40,000 children and young people in the UK aged 7-16 asking them about the risks they face when using the internet. Responses to questions about livestreaming and video-chat found that: 24% of children have livestreamed - of these children 6% were asked to remove their clothes; 12% of children have video-chatted with someone they have not met face-to-face - of these children 11% were asked to remove their clothes.

As part of Childnet's work in the UK Safer Internet Centre, they have created a Hot Topics section for parents and carers. As usual, the funds raised will go towards paying for David's education in Kenya. We have been sponsoring David, a Maasai Tribe member, through school and college since he was 14 years old.
