Parking Reminder

Vocabulary Development

Spellings are another key focus of our school development work this year. Mr Kettle has introduced 'Working Walls' which include weekly spellings on display in every classroom.



Look, Cover, Write, Check is a great way to help children learn weekly spellings, but this method does not suit every learning style. Why not try one or two of the activities below when learning spellings at home with your child this term?

Give your child a list of words (five, for example) and ask them to:

- Put them into alphabetical order
- Jumble the letters of one word for you to guess
- Trace one word on your hand or back for you to guess
- Rewrite the words using _ in place of the consonants/vowels

Parents' Evening Questionnaire

Thank you for returning so many questionnaires about parents' evenings. Both staff and parents have a clear preference for **children NOT being present** in these meetings so we shall continue with this for future meetings, beginning with our meetings in March. As I explained in a previous letter, the children have regular feedback from their class teachers, which will allow for more open discussions to be had with you without children present. The results of the questionnaire, along with a summary of your comments regarding child-free meetings, are below.

Questionnaires returned = 93

I/we prefer to hold these meetings:

With my child = 27

Without my child = 63

"This was an open consultation about my child. I feel parents can always feedback to their children."

"This allows parents to ask more specific questions. I would feedback to my child with regards to progress and the overall discussion."

"We were able to speak about any issues without making my child feel uncomfortable."

"I believe that teachers have access to the children for several hours of every day. If there is something that they needed to share in regards to their progress, ability or targets, there is plenty of opportunity to do so. I feel parent teacher meetings are a very short time for teachers to touch base and discuss progress/challenges regarding the child candidly with the parent and it is important that the child's self-image or feelings do not come into the equation for this short duration. It gives the parent AND the teacher the opportunity to discuss any of their concerns or praise."

Through your responses, we are aware that this change will cause some issues regarding child care on Parents' Evenings and will aim to open the Computing Suite, managed by a Teaching Assistant, during the March Parents' Evenings where your child can wait for you if you wish. Alternatively, your child is welcome to wait for you outside the classroom.

<u>Safequarding</u>

BBC Own It has launched a new 'Own It' app to help children getting their first smartphone stay safe online.

The wellbeing app provides a helping hand to young people who are starting to use social media and the internet more widely. The main aim of the app is to ensure that young people have a healthy experience in the digital world. The app will provide nudges, a helping hand and advice when the young person's behaviour changes or could be becoming risky.

As well as being able to access the app when they're looking for help, the app will run in the background to give them instant, on-screen advice and support the moment they need it. This will include:

- Analysing how messages and the use of certain words could be perceived by others before they hit send
- Tracking their mood over time and guidance on how to improve the situation if it's needed
- Showing a message when they are about to share their mobile number on social media before they do so, and why they might want to think twice.
