Our Curriculum

At Gayton we provide an engaging and creative curriculum that allows our children to develop the skills, vocabulary and knowledge required to succeed and to give them a secure foundation for their future years in education.

We have designed a 'Thematic' curriculum that is literature rich - linking the topic lessons with literacy units, helping to improve understanding and embed knowledge.

Our curriculum not only meets the National Curriculum requirements but also supports and nurtures the pupils and provides experiences that will help them to grow into confident, articulate, responsible citizens, giving them every opportunity to become the best that they can be.

Learning 2 Learn

Our Learning2Learn lessons enable our children to learn more independently and encourages them to be reflective about how they learn best or could learn better next time, by focusing on skills such as ordering, remembering, presenting, thinking, evaluating and decision making. This type of learning is a key feature of our foundation curriculum and helps the children to learn how to co-operate well with their classmates. Learning2Learn sits well alongside our Talk4Learning work, encouraging our children to develop their communication skills and become more articulate within the classroom; both activities help our children to learn and remember more as they progress through school.

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Our Passport of Experiences

We believe that a child’s time in school should be exciting and memorable; the best years of their lives! We offer not just an outstanding academic education, but also a broad range of fun activities and life experiences.

Our passport is a list of 50 things we believe every child between the age of 7 and 11 should experience. We provide as many of these enrichment opportunities as we can. As children complete them, they date the relevant stamps on their passport. This passport then becomes a record of all the amazing activities that our children experience during their time with us.

The list includes: make a snow angel; bake a cake; camp outside overnight; roll down a big hill; row a boat; climb a tree; hold a baby chick; visit a zoo and feel the sand between your toes!

Our Enrichment Programme

We encourage our children to ‘have a go’ at learning new skills and developing personal interests by offering a wide range of extra-curricular activities. Our School Council often ask for specific clubs and we do our best to put these on using external providers where we can. Most recently we have had weekly dance, LEGO®, Dodgeball, Choir, Cookery and Tennis Clubs running after school. There are also opportunities to learn to play the violin and ukulele!

Our Super Students

We believe every single child can be a 'Super Student'. The rewards system reflects this view and reaffirms our desire to reinforce, praise and encourage positive behaviour and attitudes.

The different awards recognise children who strive for high standards in their day-to-day work in school and in the community. They encourage pupils to be the best that they can be and give their all in whatever they do and also reward them for their effort and attitude.

Our Community

There are many opportunities for our children to develop a sense of belonging within the local community. We have strong links with our transition schools, getting to know the children before they arrive from their Key Stage 1 schools.

We recognise the diverse nature of our community and hold regular faith days, where we absorb ourselves in the culture and traditions of the six main faiths - Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism and Sikhism.

Our choir enjoys performing in the local area and our ECO Council have taken on different projects locally whilst working towards a national award. Pupil Premium

We are given additional funding for children who qualify for free school meals. This funding is used to support these children in lessons. We also use some of this funding to provide school uniform and other resources to help these children boost their reading, writing and maths skills. 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Our Achievements

We believe in celebrating our achievements and successes, whether it be individual achievements, team successes or whole school awards, which we share in our Achievement assemblies each Friday afternoon. We have children who take part in local and regional sporting and musical events; our football and other sporting teams regularly come back from tournaments with great results and our staff team recently achieved a National Online Safety accreditation following some recent safeguarding training.

Inclusion

All children have their own educational needs. As individuals, their needs vary and most will be catered for in our classroom environment. We differentiate our curriculum and set work that meets individual needs as far as possible.

Occasionally we have children who are not reaching their potential within the normal curriculum and may have a special educational need.

At Gayton Junior School we believe that all children with special educational needs (short and long term) have the right to a broad, well-balanced and where possible, inclusive curriculum. The early identification and assessment and continual monitoring of children's needs is essential. Our Special Education Needs and Disability Coordinator (SENDCO) and the support team will work with the child and their family and liaise with educational or health specialists where appropriate.
