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Parking / Drop Off

Please can I remind you if you bring your children to school by car or use a car to collect them at the end of the day, to park with care for any children or adults who may be around and with consideration for our neighbours, so that you do not block access to people's drives. I have been asked to inform you that from today Civil Enforcement Officers will be patrolling the area and issuing Penalty Charge Notices as appropriate.

There is currently a working party involving St George's, Ridgeway Infants, Gayton Juniors, local residents and councillors to address the issues of safeguarding the children who attend the schools and also the impact increased traffic has on the local residents at peak times. This working party is a direct response to safety concerns we have with a number of parents/carers who are causing risk to children in the manner of parking and manoeuvring outside schools. There are also an increasing number of parents blocking driveways and displaying aggressive behaviour to the residents. Further communications will be shared with parents as the working party develop a strategy.
