Thank you to those who took the time to complete our consultation questionnaire. The results can be found below. Having taken on board responses from parents and staff, we are planning on going ahead with the proposed changes, as outlined on the website. **Parents will be informed ahead of these lessons taking place**.

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Comments:

On the whole I do. I would be aware of children that are not emotionally as mature as their chronological age. Although their bodies are developing their emotions may not be as mature as peers. I know my son.

We are largely sympathetic with the proposed changes, particularly where there are pupils directly affected. We are also very appreciative of the school's active efforts in consulting with parents and making all this.

Happy with proposed changes

Due to hormonal changes it's better for children to know about such changes before they occur.

I think it's too early.

The maturity level of the children differs significantly but it is important to ensure that pupils are made aware as puberty is happening much earlier. It is important to prepare children for changes that will occur. A drip feed of information at different stages is helpful. It can help rather than them getting inaccurate information from their peers.

Is your child eligible for Free School Meals?



Be the best you can be!

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How do I find out?

If you are a parent or carer and receive any of the benefits below, then your child is eligible for Free School Meals.

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross household income of no more than £16,190)



- The Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

What to do next?

We would encourage parents to check whether they are eligible, **even if they think they may not be; or if they have applied before and been refused.** It's a quick and easy process to apply. If you would like to apply for Free School Meals, you can:

- Apply online at <u>https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/link2ict</u>
- Ask at the school office for details

If your application for Free School Meals is successful, Gayton Junior School will also receive Pupil Premium funding from the government to use to support your child in school.
