Mrs Kinuthia will be taking over the PPA cover in school. I'm sure you will all join me in welcoming them both to the team.




Vocabulary Development

Our Year 6 children have taken part in a Self-Esteem workshop run by the First Steps team who specialise in eating disorders, self-esteem and body image. The workshops are designed to improve self-esteem and give an understanding of how the media portrays a negative body image, that is unrealistic and false. Helping our young people to grow up with body confidence equips them with an important skill for life. The team will be returning after Christmas to visit our Year 5 classes.
