## Separated Parent Policy

I informed you last month that our new Separated Parent policy can now be found on the school website. The policy has been written in conjunction with our Data Protection Officer and some parents who kindly gave up their time to read through the policy and fed back to us to ensure we had addressed all issues faced by separated parents when dealing with school.



The policy has been written to ensure the school continues to work with families and fully involve all those with parental responsibility in the life of the school, in the best interests of the child, after parents separate. The policy is an attempt to minimise any impact, clarify to all parties what is expected from separated parents and outline what can be expected from the school and its staff.

## Road Safety

You may be aware that cameras have been installed near to St. George's Primary as part of a clampdown on bad parking in response to concern expressed by schools, parents and communities about school safety. This is part of a trial by the council who hope it will lead to drivers parking more responsibly when dropping off or collecting children from school.

As usual, can I remind you to please park responsibly when you are collecting your child from school, taking care to be respectful of our neighbours and ensuring the safety of our children and

parents who are walking home. This includes turning off your engine if you are waiting to collect: these can make walking up the road quite unpleasant for our children and their families, as well as causing unnecessary additional pollution!
