SAFEGUARDING

Does your child use live streaming sites such as Live.me, Live.ly, Omegle or Periscope? Children often enjoy these sites because they are so immediate and they can

communicate with people around the world, but the NSPCC suggest that parents need to be aware of the dangers and of who their children are talking to.

Remember, you may have parental controls set at your home to control who your child can communicate with, but there have been instances of abuse happening when the child is going online at a friend or relative's house where parental controls are not in place. The NSPCC has stressed the importance of parents and carers talking to their children about healthy relationships and staying safe online.

TUCK SHOP & HEALTHY SCHOOLS

Following the Year 6 weighing and measuring exercise last year, the local authority asked us to review our policies and procedures and do a Healthy schools audit. We have conducted this in school and have found that many of the items in our tuck shop were in contravention of the government's food standards for schools. We have therefore reluctantly decided to sell the rest of the stock from the Tuck Shop and then discontinue it. This is because the standards would only allow us to sell fresh fruit and water. We have found in the past that there has been poor take up of these items and we do not have adequate staffing and storage to do this.

It is therefore even more important that you ensure that your child has a healthy breakfast and, if necessary, brings a snack for break time which is healthy. Please do not send in sweets and chocolate as this cannot be classed as a healthy snack.

VALUE OF THE MONTH
