## <u>Eco Council</u>



Due to popular demand from staff and pupils, Mr Reed and Mrs O'Donnell set up an Eco Council last term. Teachers were asked to nominate a representative from each class to join.

They have been working hard to come up with ideas that will mean we can operate a more Eco-friendly school and have decided that their first task is to eliminate as much single-use plastic as possible. They have asked the leadership team if a drinks station can be set up in the hall at lunch times for children who bring packed lunches so that they don't have to bring disposable bottles or cartons to school for their drinks at lunchtime. On average, ten children from each class currently bring single-use plastic to school as part of their packed lunch. We think this is a great idea, so watch this space to find out more about when we will be able to start providing this! Some of you may prefer to try and find a re-usable drinks bottle that your child could bring as part of their packed lunch instead—the Eco Council are sure it's a great cost-saver!

This month, as part of their bid to earn the Eco Schools Green Flag award, the Council are converting a corner of the school field into a bee and butterfly garden. This will help to increase the bio-diversity of the local wildlife and create a teaching resource which will help our pupils' understanding of the natural world—and it will look nice too!

## <u>School Hours</u>
