We've had a wonderful week taking part in Book Week! The Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling is such a great story and the children have enjoyed the different activities the staff have planned to bring the story to life in the classroom for them. The Year 6 team have found their choice of text, 'Grimm Tales for Young and Old', by Philip Pullman, equally enjoyable and it has been great to see and hear how well all of the children have engaged with these classic texts and traditional tales during the week. We have been incredibly lucky with the weather so far this term, but I must remind you to please make sure children are in school each day with a warm, waterproof coat so they can stay warm and dry at break times. Over the 20+ years I have been working here, I know well that children learn much better if they have been able to run around, get some fresh air and stretch their legs at regular intervals during the day and, where possible, we try to get the children outside at break times—if there is light rain or drizzle, we will try and keep the children outside.

I know the staff appreciated the opportunity to meet you all properly and discuss how well your children have all settled in this year. <u>Chicken Pox Guidance</u>

Children under 10 years are most likely to catch chickenpox. But if you haven't had it before, you can get it at any age.

Symptoms of Chickenpox:

- Itchy, spotty rash of fluid filled blisters which then scab over. Please note rashes may look different depending on skin tone please visit NHS online for more information.
- Spots appear between 1 and 3 weeks after exposure and you are infectious for 48 hours before the spots appear until they have all scabbed over.
- High temperature
- Aches and pains
- · Runny nose
- Cough
- Feeling generally unwell
- Loss of appetite

People with chickenpox should avoid contact with other people for at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over.
