<u>Christmas Diary Dates</u>

Wednesday 7th December is Christmas Dinner Day. Lunches will only be provided for those children who have ordered them in advance and there will be no other options offered on the day. Please remember to send a packed lunch if you have not ordered a Christmas dinner for your child. We will provide crackers to pull!



Wednesday 7th December is also our Christmas Jumper Day - the children are welcome to come to school wearing their Christmas jumpers, or t-shirts, tights, hats—anything with a Christmas theme, in addition to their school uniform along with a £2 donation for the *Save the Children* charity please. As usual, the Office Staff will be selling Christmas pin badges and slap bands from Monday 5th December in the school hall when doors open at 8:45am each morning, this year raising money for Safe and Sound, their chosen charity. Badges and reindeer

headbands are £2, slap bands are £1, stickers are 50p a sheet and all can be worn with school uniform throughout December.

The School Council have requested **Christmas Discos** again this year. These will be held on **Thursday 15th December.** Lower School Disco will run from 5pm-6:15pm and Upper School Disco will run from 6:30pm-7:45pm. **All children MUST be collected by an adult please**. Tickets will go on Monday 12th December in the morning when doors open before school and for each day that week. Tickets cost £2 and there will be enough for everyone ©

Our Year 3 children are busy learning their lines and songs for their **Year 3 production**, which they will be performing to parents on **Wednesday 14th December** at 2pm and 6pm. Our Year 4, 5 and 6 children will watch their dress rehearsal on Tuesday 13th December so please make sure all costumes are in school before then.

On **Friday 16th December**, our Year 6 children will be visiting Nottingham Playhouse to see the pantomime Dick Whittington as part of our Passport of Experiences. This will be funded by school and a letter with more details for parents came home yesterday.

<u>Snacks & Water Bottles</u>

Please remember to send your child with a healthy snack for playtime. Snacks such as vegetable sticks, cheese strings, yoghurt pouches, fruit or cereal bars. Children should bring their snacks in their bags, not their lunchboxes/sandwich bags please. Snacks can be left in bags or trays until playtime. We have been having issues lately with children eating food that is meant for their dinner at playtime and some snacks

going missing from lunch boxes so children are not allowed access to their lunchboxes and sandwich bags once they have left them on the shelves or the trolleys ready for lunchtime.

In lessons, we like to encourage the children to keep them hydrated, as this helps them to concentrate better throughout the day and helps to keep them well. To avoid ruining work if there are spillages, we have a **still water only** rule for drinks in the classroom. Children can bring in their own, named water bottles—ideally with a sports cap or similar to drink from—which they should take home daily to be cleaned.



<u>School Dinners</u>

Next week, we will be on our Week 2 Dinner Menu. Dinners are £2.20 per day and children can switch between dinners and sandwiches from home daily if they wish.
