Please make sure children are wearing suitable footwear for walking to bowling and also for bowling itself.

Parking Around School

I am, once again, finding it necessary to remind you all, please, to be more considerate of *how* and *where* you park when you are dropping off and collecting your children. I was concerned recently to hear of two instances of aggressive behaviour by drivers towards staff outside school and, once again, I am receiving complaints of aggressive behaviour from our neighbours and those living in surrounding streets: parents once again blocking driveways and refusing to move cars to let residents out saying they, "will only be a few minutes" is incredibly disrespectful and it is no wonder they have reached out to local councillors now for some support with this.

With the increasing frequency of these incidents, I feel it necessary to request that parents and guardians remember the importance of considerate and SAFE parking, specifically, ensuring that driveways are not blocked and would, again, encourage parking slightly further away, if necessary, to avoid congestion.
