It has been a particularly cold start back to school this week but the children have started back with a bang and are already working hard—I was pleased to hear lots of really focused New Year's Resolutions in assembly on Monday and I have challenged those who have not made one yet to have a go at reading more in 2026—it is the National Year of Reading in the UK so we discussed setting small targets: reading a set number of pages a night or chapters a week; trying out a new author or genre of books to their normal preference; reading to learn something new or perhaps trying to complete a '*Recommended books to be read by the time you are 8/9/10/11*' list by using the library!

Thank you for your understanding today regarding the school closure. Despite the efforts of our Premises Team on Thursday evening in spreading a good amount of grit—no amount was going to be enough to prevent the ground from being slippery beneath the top layer of snow. When I arrived on site this morning, it was clear that your journeys to school today would not be safe. Decisions like these are not taken without a great deal of thought and not without collaboration with Mrs Dale at Ridgeway too, and, of course, we have to factor in whether or not we can provide hot meals as well as a safe site for the day for children and staff. It is rare to get days like today in the UK—I have only had to shut the school once before due to snow in 7 years of headship—but it is always worth checking your notifications are set to ON for your Parent App settings to be sure that you see the message in plenty of time. We also popped news of the closure onto our Facebook page and we inform the Local Authority who, in turn, I believe reported it to the Telegraph but this did not make their online report until 9am, so Parent App is the quickest and most reliable form of communicating with you.

We have lots more exciting curriculum activities and learning planned for the children this term. Please look out for letters coming home with some more information about what has been planned for each year group—further details can be found on our [Curriculum](#) pages on the school website.

Please remember that I am still *unable* to authorise any term-time leave of absence requests this year and, in the majority of cases, these will incur fines. These requests should be made in advance and not retrospectively please.
