We are also working hard to make sure that next year's budget can support us in continuing to provide support for all of the trips and visitors that we feel enhance our curriculum and provide memorable, hands on learning experiences for our children. However, there will always be times when we do require a contribution towards these costs from parents or we will not be able to continue to run these trips or invite these visitors into school. Thank you for your support with this: the new budget cannot support dinner money debts going forward.
