Thank you to everyone who has joined us either today or yesterday for one of our Sports Days. We had two lovely mornings and it was great to see so many families out supporting our children over the two days. Thanks, as always, to Ms Hallam for organizing another successful two days.

Book Bags

As the end of the year approaches, could we remind you to avoid buying expensive school bags for your children? We routinely get pulled up on Health and Safety audits and Fire audits that our cloakrooms in the corridors take up too much room and this is due to the size of the bags that children are bringing to school—these very often knock off coats hung on top onto the floor.



From September 2025, children will only be allowed to bring a book bag to school: there is no need for a larger bag than this—a book bag will fit a water bottle and reading books and this is all the children NEED to bring to school each day.

From 30th June, the school office will be selling book bags: you will be able to purchase these directly using your School Money account and they will be sent home with your child. Alternatively, book bags can be purchased directly from uniform suppliers Schoolwear Solutions, Chaddesden or Uniform Direct on Babington Lane. Plain navy book bags from other suppliers are also available (e.g. Amazon).

Next week we will be on our new Week 3 menu, which can be found $\frac{\text{here}}{\text{cost}}$. School dinners cost £2.80 each day and must be paid for in advance please.



Could we please ask that you start to clear any dinner debts before the end of term, particularly if you are a Year 6 parent. The school budget cannot afford to sustain ongoing dinner debts and Mrs Waqstaff spends a large amount of time each week issuing reminders to parents.

Chickenpox!

It is that time of year and we have a small number of cases of chickenpox in school this week. Worryingly, *some* parents have been sending children to school with rashes while they are still contagious, despite advice from the staff in the school office!

If you are concerned that your child may have chickenpox, please seek the advice of your doctor in the first instance. Chickenpox remains contagious until <u>ALL</u> the spots have formed a scab. Only then can children return to school—provided they also feel well enough.



This is important advice to follow, as we have children in school with weakened immune systems and a pregnant member of staff—please help us by being vigilant and following NHS guidance, which can be found here.
