### Coming Up Next Week....

It's a busy week next week, so please make sure you know what is happening in school for your child!

### Monday 21st July—Year 6 Leavers' Party

Our Year 6 Leavers' Party is on Monday. **Starting at 5:30 and ending at 7:30pm**, children may bring a phone to take pictures of their friends, with a permission slip (their class teachers will send one home).

### Tuesday 22nd July—French Day—see page 4

On Tuesday, we will be celebrating our annual French Day again in school. Children are welcome to come to school wearing a splash of something red, white and blue along with their school uniform (no jeans or football shirts please). We will start the day with a special assembly and our usual French breakfast before enjoying some activities in class.

Wednesday 23rd July—Silver & Bronze Reward Day—Water Fights—Non-uniform Day All children can come to school in non-uniform today. Children taking part in the water fight for the silver reward should come with a change of clothes to change into after the water fight please remember to bring dry pants, shoes and socks! And don't forget a towel and a water gun! Bronze rewards—a class film—will also take place today so children can bring a snack to eat while they watch their film!

### Thursday 24th July—Gold Reward Day—Non-uniform Day

All children can come to school in non-uniform today (Year 6 children may want to wear their school t-shirts to be signed). As today is the gold reward day on the inflatables, children should wear clothes suitable for this and make sure they have socks on or a pair of socks with them to put on when they go on the inflatables.

### <u>PE Kit</u>

Please remember that we would ask children to continue to come to school wearing PE kit (t-shirt, navy sweatshirt or cardigan, navy or black tracksuit bottoms and plain trainers) on days when they have PE. Being ready for PE means we lose less time from PE lessons getting changed in and out of kit and means we don't have to worry about where to store their PE bags during the week.

Again, it would be most ideal if you could buy black trainer shoes instead of school shoes in your 'uniform shop' this summer—this means the



children will have appropriate footwear for completing the daily mile. If you are not able to find anything suitable, please make sure your child brings their trainers to school each day to change into.

PE days for next year are listed in the table below for your child's **new** class. We are continuing swimming lessons for the children moving into Year 4 to give as many children as possible the chance to build on the great progress they have made with their water confidence this year and to allow them time to achieve the Key Stage 2 objective of being able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. Sports Premium funding will be used to pay for these additional lessons and we are grateful to the pool for finding us three additional slots to allow time for Classes 4, 5 and 6 to swim next year. This swimming session will replace one of the PE lessons in Year 4 so that they still have time for all of the other exciting curriculum topics that the Year 4 staff have planned for them across the year—the team will let you know whether the PE unit for each half term will be indoor or outdoor so you know when to send your child in their PE kit.
