


- **Linton Kwesi Johnson:** Johnson is a poet who writes poems mixed with music to talk about fairness and equality. His poems helped people understand the struggles of Black people in the UK.
- Olive Morris: Olive was a brave woman who helped people in her community get homes and fought for equal treatment for Black women in the UK.
- **Benjamin Zephaniah:** Zephaniah was a famous poet and writer who used his words to fight against unfairness and racism. His poems are full of energy and make people think about how we can make the world better. His poetry is used in PSHE and Literacy units in Upper School.
- **Dr. George Africanus:** A long time ago, Dr. Africanus started one of the first job agencies in the UK, helping people find work. He showed that Black people could be successful in business, even when it was very hard for them to do so.
