School Development

Along with curriculum development work to address our OFSTED action points, this year we are looking to further reduce persistent absence in school, in line with DfE targets. Persistent absence is the term given when attendance falls below 90% and can cause a concern in terms of children falling behind their peers in lessons. To help us provide support for families and children, we have looked beyond the local authority and engaged with TEAM Education Trust who will be supporting us **in partnership** with this drive for the current academic year.



Mrs Allyson Fudge and Ms Nicola Rees from the Trust will be in school on Tuesdays, working alongside staff and with children and families to help us promote good attendance in school. Mrs Fudge will also be supporting families with early help support. We are looking forward to working with them.


